## **Older natural avalanche**

I came across this older avalanche yesterday when I was guiding a group in the Kirkwood area, it's an area in the Cabin Creek drainage. It looked to be an older natural <u>slide</u> probably just after the last storm cycle a few days to almost a week ago now. After seeing the old <u>slide</u> and taking a look we found a safe slope with the same <u>aspect</u> approximately 300 yards away with the same NNE <u>aspect</u>, dug a pit and did an ECT test with stabile results.

Kirkwood

North, North East Aspect

Approximately 39 degree slope (Because of a creek with open water just below the <u>slide</u>, I couldn't get close enough to accurately measure the slope)

ECTX...When digging the pit we could see what looked like 2 weak layers in the snow pack and a faceted layer at the ground. We had no failures during the test and even after the test when I pulled and pried with a shovel, the snow held together and showed signs of <u>stability</u>.
