From email: "Found this large [slide](#) just north of Imp today [10/25]. Right around 10k, N-NE [aspect](#), crowns spanned estimated 800-1,000' and ranged from ~2-10' thick. Appeared to activate by both a [weak layer](#) near the ground and a mid-pack interface. Lower interface was pencil hard, variably icy melt freeze crust of some sort, with 10-20 cms of 2-3mm facets underneath. Didn't get a good handle on the mid-pack interface, mostly assumed its presence based on shallower crowns.

Also saw several other crowns, at similar and slightly lower elevations on similar aspects to the SW of above described [slide](#). Other crowns appeared thinner and less wide."
